NE Branch member speaks at the Senate Inquiry into RIFA

New England Branch member Susie Hester recently addressed the Senate Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport References Committee Inquiry into Red Imported Fire Ants in Australia. The ants have been subject to eradication since first discovered in Brisbane in 2001. While the programme has significantly slowed the spread, the eradication area continues to grow, and with it, impacts. Susie's appearance was in response to a submission that she had put together with colleagues from the Centre of Excellence for Biosecurity Risk Analysis (CEBRA; University of



Melbourne) into the potential economic impacts of RIFA, and what can be done to minimise these.
